

A Light in the Country The Lord went in front of them to give them light.


Exodus 13:21

Go to: tithe.ly/give_new/www/#/tithely/give and log in or set up an account. Search for "Mayfield Congregational" and choose our church. You will be taken to a transaction screen. Fill in the amount you would like to donate. Just to the right is a drop down list so that you may tell us what kind of contribution you are making (general, OCWM, etc.); there is a notes section at the bottom where you can be more specific if necessary. Should you wish to set up a recurring donation, check that box. Scroll down and enter your credit card or bank account information (please consider covering the processing fees). Complete your transaction and the money is electronically deposited into Mayfield's bank account. By returning to Tithe.ly's home page, you can view previous donation activity.

Moderator: Addressed need for congregants with questions, suggestions, or complaints to bring them to a Council member or ask to be on the next Council meeting agenda. Issues about music should be directed to a Deacon (Jan, Wilma, or Cary). Noted that last financial statements reflected a lower than anticipated deficit. Discussed members graduating high school and college this year and next.

Trustee: Mower may need some work later this year.

Treasurer: Flower Power fundraiser netted us \$296. Discussed cost and plans for propane this fall.

Moderator: T-shirts are being sold in June to coincide with Pride Month. Sausage and corn drive through lunch will be held on Sunday, July 31. Working with Mayfield Cemetery to hold joint 2023 Memorial Day ceremony. Mayfield has reserved a spot at the Kirkland Community Fair on Saturday 9/10. Discussed July hiatus for Council; next meeting will be in August. Jan Wylde volunteered to head the Prayer Tree.

Pastor: Time report for prior month was submitted: 34 pastoral contacts. Discussed event plans for the next couple of months.

Deacons: Search is on-going for a new Music Director. Have arranged for fill-in musicians for some Sundays through the summer.

Christian Ed: Bibles were presented to three of our children around 3rd grade age. An all-ages Bible Trivia evening was hosted at the church on Saturday May 21. Wednesdays in the Waystation with First Congregational in DeKalb is in final planning stages.

Missions: The Father's Day special offering will go to the UCC's Our Church's Wider Mission. Strengthen the Church offering will be taken in August.

Other: It was decided to have a hot dog lunch around the fire in the Waystation on Sunday, July 3.
