

A Light in a messenger's eyes brings joy to the heart

Proverbs 15:30

Happy New Year! We stand at the precipice of so many opportunities! What will 2023 hold for us? It is exciting to contemplate, knowing that God wants good things for us.

I like to reorient myself each January, to remind myself of what I should be basing my goals on. For Mayfield Church, our Constitution: Article II – PURPOSE says:

The avowed purpose of this Church shall be to worship God, to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ, to celebrate the Sacraments, to realize Christian fellowship and unity with the Church and the Church universal, to render loving service toward humanity, and to strive for righteousness, justice, and peace.

The directive "to render loving service toward humanity" stood out to me. And I know exactly why. It goes right along with something that I've been pushed to consider. Recently I've been getting nudges from the Spirit about the value of genuinely seeing other people. First a kind woman explained to me that she operates a one-woman "I See You" campaign – purposefully speaking to individuals directly, expressing a compliment or word of encouragement; she wants them to know that they matter to someone. Then I heard about a Christmas tree covered in mirror ornaments; the theme was "I See You" and you matter. Most recently I pulled a book off my shelf and to my surprise I found an entire chapter on "truly being seen" as a basic human need.

In Luke 7:36-50, we read of Jesus eating at a Pharisee's home. Somehow a sinful woman, uninvited, came into the Pharisee's house and sat down beside Jesus. She washed his feet and wept. The righteous men at the table ignore her, and are appalled that Jesus allows the woman to minister to him in this way. There must have been some murmuring going on because Jesus then decides to use this as a teachable moment. Jesus asks his disciple, "do you see this woman?" Oh, what a convicting question! Not do you see what she is, or what she is doing. But do you see this woman. Seeing as Jesus sees means seeing beyond stereotypes, or labels, or emotions, or condemnation. Seeing as Jesus sees requires some action on our part; it might even require us to change!

"I See You" will be a recurring theme this month at Mayfield. I encourage you to reach out and let others know that you see them, you value them, you care about them – that you see them. Talk to people at church, mail or text a note, call someone you haven't spoken with recently. Branch out and try it in the community. Solomon had it right when he said, "light in a messenger's eyes brings joy to the heart." When we actually see others, when there is a light connecting us, joy comes into their heart at being seen. Let's do what our Constitution says our purpose is and render a little loving service toward humanity.

How much should I be giving?

You should be giving an amount that feels right when you discuss it with God.

I'm barely getting by and don't have much extra.

Give what you can but do not put your health or living accommodations in jeopardy. Jesus pointed out that the widow's few pennies (Mark 12:42-44) showed great faith.

I prefer to share my charitable donations with several organizations.

Good for you! Most of us do. But make giving to Mayfield's general operating fund a priority so that we can continue to be a presence in the community.

I volunteer my time; that's enough.

No, it's really not. We sincerely thank you for the time and talents you offer, but you also need to consider financial support.

What is a tithe?

10% of your income. Some feel this is 10% of gross income, others think it should be 10% of take-home pay; it's a personal decision.

Should I tithe?

The Bible says yes: "Be sure to set aside a tenth of all that your fields produce each year" (Deut. 14:22), and "bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it" (Malachi 3:10).

Let's get personal. Does the pastor tithe?

Yes, Pastor Lauri leads by example. She contributes 10% of her income back to Mayfield using the tithe.ly app with a convenient monthly automatic bank transfer.

Does my support matter?

Yes, yes, yes! Whatever amount you give makes an enormous difference and together we are Mayfield strong!




3. Use your bank's on-line banking option.

4. Make an electronic contribution through **Tithe.ly**. (while there are many on-line options available, several council members have tested this one).

Go to: **tithe.ly/give_new/www/#/tithely/give** and log in or set up an account. Search for "Mayfield Congregational" and choose our church. You will be taken to a transaction screen. Fill in the amount you would like to donate. Just to the right is a drop down list so that you may tell us what kind of contribution you are making (general, OCWM, etc.); there is a notes section at the bottom where you can be more specific if necessary. Should you wish to set up a recurring donation, check that box. Scroll down and enter your credit card or bank account information (please consider covering the processing fees). Complete your transaction and the money is electronically deposited into Mayfield's bank account. By returning to Tithe.ly's home page, you can view previous donation activity.

Reports from Council meeting – December 2022

Guest: Nominating Committee presented recommendations for new officers for the positions of Moderator, Clerk, and Deacon at the January 2023 Congregational Meeting. The positions of Christian Education, Stewardship, and Trustee remain open; options to fill/cover were discussed.

Trustees: Garage door opener and kitchen faucet in the parsonage need to be replaced; waiting on handyman to install. Garbage pick up service has begun.

Treasurer: at Dec 19, there is a year-to-date net shortfall of approximately \$9,800 (money is taken from savings when necessary); this includes several non budgeted repair bills and is less of a deficit than was projected. The UCC 5 for 5 giving to date was discussed versus the budgeted amount of \$3600. A motion was made and passed to send in only what members have donated plus the income from restricted funds designated for missions. Billy will be on vacation until January 4th; in his absence, a Deacon and a Trustee will count receipts together and make bank deposits through December 31 so that the 2022 books will reflect accurate giving.

Moderator: reminded Council members that 2022 reports and budgets are due ASAP for the Annual Congregational Meeting on Jan 8. Reviewed weather closing procedures. Discussed COVID-flu-RSV conditions in our area and what precautions we should take. A motion was made and passed to bring to the congregation a recommendation to change the church's fiscal year end and annual meeting date.

Pastor: : time report submitted; 58 pastoral contacts. Vacation time was requested and granted for Mon, February 6th through Sun, February 12th. Ways to reach out to inactive members was discussed. Plowing/salting arrangements were reviewed; zoom meetings were encouraged for other than Sunday mornings. Results of the November 'What If...?' poll were shared.

Deacons: a permanent part-time Music Director has been hired and will start on January 1, 2023. Communion service continues to be assessed.

Christian Ed: no report.

Mission: no report.
