2 Peter 1:19

Greetings!

Why do you go to church? Or...why do you no longer go to church?

So many churches are lamenting that a group of people have not returned to worship after the pandemic shutdown. Often I hear "they just got out of the habit of attending." That makes me wonder, though, if any of us should be coming to worship simply out of habit. What actually brings us to church on Sunday? Is it habit, a sense of responsibility, or guilt? Is it the welcome, knowing that we are part of a family, or connecting with others? Is it the music, seeing the sun enhance the stained-glass windows, or a connection with generations before us who met God in this same space? Do you seek comfort, inspiration, or knowledge? Seriously, why do you come to church?

That question is paramount for those trying to figure out why some people have not returned to Sunday worship. Complicating their process of discovery is that the answer is unique for each person. Why did they attend previously? What would draw them back to church now? Perhaps instead of getting bogged down in trying to find an answer, churches should simply do what we are called to do: live out our faith. The New Testament book of I Peter is full of hope and encouragement in this regard. Peter tells us that Jesus has given us everything we need, and that we should endeavor to grow our faith with goodness, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, mutual affection, and love. Peter goes on to say in verse 19, "We also have the prophetic message as something completely reliable, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts." Positive, engaging, welcoming people draw others. We have everything we need to attract others to church. Let's live our faith and let it be "as a light shining in a dark place."

As for this humble pastor, I agree with David, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'" (Psalm 122:1). Whatever brings you to church, we'll warmly welcome you.


SATURDAY, MAY 6 TACOS AND TRIVIA

JAMMIN' FOR JAMS AND EMILY AKINYI OWALA

Every year since 2011, members and friends of Mayfield Church have given a scholarship to support a girl at Jane Adeny Memorial School for Girls (JAMS). In Kenya, even public high schools require families to pay fees and room & board, so high school is out of reach for many, especially girls. The mission of JAMS is to provide "education good enough for the richest, open to the poorest."

Last year, our current student, Emily Akinyi Owala started her high school education at JAMS. In the 2022 school year, she earned a B+ average. Her best grades are in physics and chemistry; she may turn out to be a scientist!

Emily began Form Two (sophomore year) at JAMS in January. During the month of March, we are asking for your donations to help provide Emily's second year of high school. A full scholarship is \$800. Scholarships to JAMS provide tuition, room & board, clothes, books, school supplies, toiletries, and routine medical care—everything students need to be successful.

JAMS founders and directors, Teresa Wasonga and Andrew Otieno, will visit Mayfield on Sunday, March 12, to visit with the Sunday School, attend worship, and speak with the congregation after worship. Also, the theme of Sunday School March 5, 12, and 19 will be "Jammin' for JAMS;" the Sunday School will learn about Kenya, the importance of giving to others, and the difference education makes for young people in poverty.

Reports from Council meeting – February 2023

Council met on 2/20/23 - 11 members present, 1 absent

Pastor: Time and reimbursement report submitted. Music Copyright information updated. Lenten events include Ash Wednesday Service and Bible Study. Discussed events past and listed in this newsletter. Along with confirmation we will be celebrating graduation and new member Sunday.

Deacons: Decorating for Easter with live plants ordered from G&E Greenhouse in Elburn. Easter Sunday events include: 7:30 am (outdoor) Easter Sunrise Service; Brunch; 10 am (indoor) Church Service; and Easter Egg Hunt.

Trustees: Repairs continue around the church. Following up on water testing, Elevator maintenance, checking fire extinguishers, smoke detectors and contacting Exterminator to do a recheck.

Stewardship: Advisory group met on Jan 29, report presented to council. Initiatives to consider starting: Member Stewardship talks and return to passing collection plate during Sunday Service. Planning process for a Capital Campaign. Other ideas will be looked at by advisory group and council.

Budget was approved with one abstaining vote. Approval of budget needs to come before the congregation for a vote along with approval of Final Financial Statement for 2022.
