Spring is determined to arrive despite the chilly regressions we keep experiencing. I see flowers pushing up from the earth and buds on the trees. In northern Illinois, the Redbud and Dogwood trees with bright blossoms are welcome and direct our thoughts forward to the wonder of renewal and possibilities of summer. In Israel, the Almond tree is often the first to flower bringing the same sense of wonder and potential.

The Almond tree is mentioned several times in the Bible, including when Moses is on the mountain having that long chat with God and receiving the famous stone tablets. A good deal of the discussion then is God giving directions to Moses about building a place of worship, what to have inside it, and the designs that should adorn each piece. The lampstand is to feature almond blossoms. A flower of beauty, one that arrives after a time of rest, a season of dormancy, when life has been more difficult. God is quite firm with Moses on this point ("See that you make them according to the pattern shown to you").

I find it fascinating that God is demanding beautiful flowers to adorn things where worship is to take place! A reminder in the Almond blossom that God promises renewal, that even in the hard times we can look forward to new possibilities. The instructions that Moses is given for constructing these lampstands also directs that the flowers are to be formed so that when filled with oil and the wicks lit, the light will shine forward to illuminate the way for others.

As you drink in the spring sunshine and admire the flowering trees (in between those dreary cold, rainy days that have been hanging around), I hope you will be reminded of God's love, be filled with the hope of endless possibilities, and then shine that light forward to encourage others.

The Prairie Association of the Illinois Conference of the United Church of Christ held their Spring meeting on Saturday, April 29th at Pilgrim Park Camp. Pastor Lauri reconnected with friends, made new connections, and came away with some fresh ideas. Rev. Molly Carlson, our Conference Minister, gave a brief financial update for the Conference. The OCWM offerings in 2022 fell short of the budgeted amount of \$1.1 million, coming in at \$900,000 (80% of OCWM funds stay at the Conference to fund operating costs, including salaries). So far this year, several unexpected inflows of cash have been received from the sale of property and legacy gifts. These have helped to recover from previous years' deficits.

Waystation Updates!

Diane Hance, Sue Goudy, and Diana Swanson planted five shrubs in the Waystation today. These native shrubs were chosen because they provide leaves for butterfly caterpillars and flowers for adult butterflies. They were placed to help provide more of a windbreak for the Waystation as they get bigger. They are prairie willow (Salix humilis humilis), gray dogwood (Cronus racemosa), and chokecherry (prunus virginiana).

The prairie smoke flowers are blooming now. In a few weeks or a month the flowers will become "smoky" seed heads.

The last four years have been very difficult with not being able to meet during the Pandemic and the continuing financial challenges that it has presented. Mayfield celebrates its 163rd birthday this year. A 163-year-old church will continue to have unexpected big-ticket items that present themselves that are not in our operating budget. These include roofing, building siding, kitchen appliance replacement, bathroom updates, storm damage and tree care and removal.
