

A Light in the Country

Is a lamp brought in to be put under the bushel basket?

Mark 4:21

"We find fresh hope when we understand that God always starts in the wilderness with marginalized people on the edge...and if the work of God typically begins in the wilderness, rural places are poised to channel the renewal of the church." ¹ There are so many small, rural churches that feel like they are "on the edge," worrying about survival, existing in the wilderness, and feeling marginalized when ideas or suggestions seem more realistic for a larger congregation in a more urban setting. Mayfield is one of the many small, rural churches who struggle with these issues. Our membership numbers are small, our finances are worrying, our congregation leans more toward elderly, we have few children attending. But read that again: God always starts in the wilderness with marginalized people on the edge.

I recently reviewed what we at Mayfield have accomplished during the past two years. Some of them were: hosted the Garden Walk, offered classes in the Waystation, partnered with other churches andorganizations, instituted a Safe Church Policy, added online donation options, cleaned the entire church, added streaming and recording of our services, began providing a newsletter, invited the community to events, supported area non-profits, gave Bibles to three young girls, completed a Confirmation Class with two teens, and welcomed 11 new members. Keep in mind: God always starts in the wilderness with marginalized people on the edge.

People search many places, looking at all kinds of things, just to find "something" that will resonate with them. When our mission, our sharing of God's love, is done authentically and genuinely, with caring, it becomes contagious. People will be drawn to us because almost everyone wants to feel welcome and part of a community where the world is improved. Do you know what Mayfield's constitution says that our purpose is? "To worship God, to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ, to celebrate the Sacraments, to realize Christian fellowship and unity with the Church and the Church universal, to render loving service toward humanity, and to strive for righteousness, justice, and peace." If the work of God typically begins in the wilderness, rural places are poised to channel the renewal of the church.

Mayfield has such a vibrant history. We have rendered loving service and striven for justice to escaping slaves, we offer acceptance to all persons including LGBTQ+, and we maintain a habitat for Monarch butterflies and pollinators. We provide fellowship and food to all who come to us for worship. And as we relax in the garden or gaze across the fields of corn, there is a peace that descends and calms us. In Mark 4:21-22, Jesus asked, "Is a lamp brought in to be put under the bushel basket or under the bed and not on the lampstand? For there is nothing hidden, except to be disclosed; nor is anything secret, except to come to light." We let our light shine with God's radiance when we act authentically, genuinely, and with love for all people. We find fresh hope when we understand that God always starts in the wilderness with marginalized people on the edge... and if the work of God typically begins in the wilderness, rural places are poised to channel the renewal of the church.

I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord!" (Psalm 122:1). I have faith that God is already doing great things in and through Mayfield, and I am so very excited to see what else we will be called to do.

Mayfield Church was organized in October 1860 -163 years ago! What was the United States like back then?

- Abraham Lincoln won the Presidential election in November.
- The nation was on the verge of the Civil War (1861-1865).
- The Pony Express began between St. Joseph, MO and Sacramento, CA.
- There were 31 million residents in the United States Chicago was the 9th largest urban area with 112,172 people.
- Most of the population lived in rural areas.
- The 1860 census reported DeKalb County with 9,570 horses, 9,299 milch cows, 585 working oxen, 14,060 cother cattle, and 3,902 sheep. Production included 829,716 bushels of wheat and 496,448 bushels of Indian corn. (https://agcensus.library.cornell.edu)

NEIGHBORS IN NEED OFFERING




ABOUT THE ARTIST:

Church in Stratford, Wi closed their doors and we are to be the recipient of their altar paraments.

10/8 Mayfield 16rd Anniversary Celebration – Celebrating long standing members, welcoming new members and celebrating our heritage. A Potluck will be held after church 10/15 Pulpit Exchange w/Grace UCC, Sauk Village (grucc.org)

Deacons: Excited about paraments. Setting Deacon duty schedule.
