A Light in the Country the Lord will be your everlasting light -Isaiah 60:20 Advent – a time of waiting and of searching. Mary and Joseph searched for a place to welcome their baby. The shepherds searched for a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. The magi searched for the young child born 'King of the Jews.' And each Christmas season we search for Jesus. We read again the passages in Matthew and Luke of his birth, we sing favorite holiday songs, we give gifts that we hope others will like, often we attend a candlelight service on Christmas Eve. But are we truly looking for Jesus? C.S. Lewis once wrote, "there comes a moment when people who have been dabbling in religion ("man's search for God") suddenly draw back. Supposing we really found Him? We never meant it to come to that! Worse still, supposing He had found us?" Imagine if we did find Jesus each Advent...would we be happy, excited, joyful? Or perhaps stunned, afraid, reluctant? It is much easier to simply be searching for God rather than actually discover God. Searching allows us to stand back and observe; finding and engaging requires action on our part. Discovering God elicits a response from us; we are moved to live in different ways. It may be hard and messy and take us out of our comfort zones but it can also be completely amazing. The shepherds left their responsibilities behind to find Jesus; once they did they told everyone about this wondrous event. The magi traveled a long, long way but "rejoiced with exceedingly great joy." I sincerely hope that you find Jesus this Advent season. I pray that each of us is reawakened to the message of love that he brought: God loves you. As you prepare for Christmas and enjoy traditions, keep searching for Jesus. And allow that everlasting light to influence you to love God, love yourself, and love your neighbors. Rejoice! Advent blessings, Paster Cauri Pastor Lauri


