Mayfield Congregational UCC, Federated Church, and 1st Congregational UCC are offering a two-part series exploring the threat of Christian Nationalism, democracy, and how people of faith can work for the common good. Join us at Federated (612 W. State St, Sycamore) on Tuesday, October 8 as Senior Research Analyst for Political Research Associates Fred Clarkson presents on Christian Nationalism and the Threat to American Democracy, and on Tuesday, October 15 as we discuss Faith in Action for the Common Good; both sessions run from 6:30pm to 8:00pm.

The 2024 documentary GOD & COUNTRY, according to the promo on Amazon.com, "looks at the implications of Christian Nationalism and how it distorts not only our constitutional republic, but Christianity itself. Featuring prominent Christian thought leaders, GOD & COUNTRY asks this question: What happens when a faith built on love, sacrifice, and forgiveness grows political tentacles, conflating power, money, and belief into hyper-nationalism?"

This movie is available on Amazon Prime Video for free and the information it contains will be helpful to those attending the Faith and Democracy Under Threat meetings at Federated Church. ### WE NEED YOU!

There are many opportunities coming up where you can make a real difference and serve Mayfield Church! Let Sophia or Pastor Lauri know if you are interested or have any questions.

• Nominating Committee – 2-3 members are needed to serve. This is a short-term obligation and involves asking others to be on the slate of new Council Officers for our January annual meeting.

• **Council** – there will be multiple positions open. The church and its ability to function depends on having a full Council. All non-profits, including churches, must have a Board in place to maintain their legal status.

• Delegates – Mayfield needs to elect and send two delegates to both the Prairie Association fall meeting (Saturday, September 28 in Peru) and the IL Conference annual meeting (Friday/Saturday, November 1-2 in Western Springs). Pastor Lauri will be attending both meetings but she cannot be a delegate for Mayfield; pastors represent themselves and vote accordingly. Each church sends delegates that represent the congregation and they vote on behalf of the congregation.

#### Mayfield Congregational United Church of Christ – Special Congregational Meeting. September 22, 2024.

Sophia Varcados, moderator called the meeting to order. Welcoming and thanking everyone for attending. Clerk, Diane Hance reported that 17 members were in attendance and this meets the 15% requirement for a quorum. (We currently have 80 members)

Andy Hargrave, Treasurer, thanked everyone for their participation, donations and support of Mayfield. Andy presented our current financial situation, and explained that our checking and savings account are running low on funds and he asked that the church membership vote, allowing the treasurer to move funds from investments or CD's into checking/savings account.

Jen Conley moved to allow the church treasurer to move funds from investments or CD into checking to meet bills as needed. Sue Goudy seconded this motion. A verbal vote was taken by members in attendance and all voted in the affirmative. Motion passed.

Although money concerns are often at the forefront, Sophia explained that we are to focus on what is needed in terms of participation by members that will allow us to continue to keep Mayfield Church operational. Last year the Nominating Committee had a difficult time finding people who would agree to take on Council positions. Some positions were not filled, and we have been covering them as best we can. This year most of the Council positions need to be filled; we wanted to bring this to your attention now instead of waiting until the end of the year. We want to break down walls and think creatively. Be forward thinkers.

Sophia began with a review of council positions, who holds them, and whose term ends at the end of this church year. More information will come out on these positions.

What happens if we cannot fill council positions? What does Mayfield and the council need? We need and want

- to be here for each other and to keep our doors open.
- coverage of church operations.
- help that does not require a tremendous amount of oversight or management.
- the kind of help that comes forward and offers specific services repeatedly.
- to know what people are willing to offer, and what makes them reticent to do so.
- creative management of our resources.
- to protect the energy and efforts of those who do offer services so that the dependency on viability is not resting on only a few shoulders.

What can you do?

- give our situation some thought.
- challenge yourself to come up with solutions based on resources and people that we have now, and that do not require staffing, resources, or abilities that are not identifiable.
- Less of an idea, more of a plan.
- Try not to "add" tasks but focus on fine-tuning what is already in motion.
- Share your ideas via email or arrange to present them to the council.

We are rich in history and people. We are the light in the country.


